1. Activity:

- Draw or paste a picture of yourself in the centre of an A4 sheet.
- Write 5 sentences about:

i) Your name, age, and school.

ii) Your favourite food, color, and hobby.

- Decorate the sheet with color or stickers.

2. Activity:

- Create a simple family tree on a chart paper. Include:
- Your parents, grandparents, and siblings (or relatives you live with).
- Write one special thing about each family member (e.g., "Mom cooks delicious food").
- Add photos or draw faces.

3. Activity:

- Activity must be done:

i) Make a collage (using pictures, drawings, or magazine cut-outs) of fun activities you do with your family (e.g., picnics, festivals, games).

ii) Write 2-3 lines about your favourite memory with your family.

HINDI LITERATURE

1. Chapter: "बादल आया"

Activity: Cloudy Fun!

- Draw a happy cloud (बादल) on an A4 sheet and color it.
- Write 3 words related to rain (e.g., पानी, छाता, मेंढक) around the cloud.
- Bonus: Sing the poem aloud with actions and record a short video!

2. Chapter: "कितनी प्यारी है यह दुनिया"

Activity: My Beautiful World

- Cut out 3 pictures of things you love (e.g., flowers, animals, toys) from old magazines.
- Paste them on scrap book and write their Hindi names (e.g., फूल, बिल्ली, गुड़िया).

3. Chapter: "मनकेभोले-भालेबादल"

Activity: Emotion Clouds

- Draw 3 clouds in scrap book with different faces (happy, angry, and surprised) and color them.
- Write the emotion in Hindi next to each (e.g., खुश, गुस्सा, हैरान).

General Instructions:

- Use colors, stickers, or glitter to make your work bright.
- Submit your work in a handmade folder decorated with Hindi letters (e.g., अ, आ, इ).
- Parent's Note: Help your child read the words aloud and encourage creativity!

Reward: The most colourful and neat homework will get a "Hindi Star" badge!

SUBJECT - HINDI GRAMMAR

1. Activity:

• Task:

- Cut and paste pictures from magazines/newspapers that start with each vowel (अ, आ, इ, ई, उ, ऊ, etc.) on a scrap book.
- Write the corresponding vowel letter next to each picture (e.g., अ for अनार).
- Objective: Reinforces vowel recognition and vocabulary.

2. Activity:

• Task:

- Make 5 flashcards with simple Hindi words (e.g., फल, पेड़, किताब).
- Arrange them to form 2-3 sentences (e.g., "मैं फल खाता हूँ।") on a chart paper.
- Illustrate one sentence with a drawing.
- Objective: Builds sentence formation skills and creativity.

3. Activity:

- **Task:**

- Write a 3-line story using words learned (e.g., "एक लड़का था। वह पार्क गया। उसने फल खाया।").
- Add drawings to make it a mini-comic strip.
- Make it in Scrap book.

SUBJECT - MATHS

Theme: "Math Magic!"

1. Numbers and Numeration

Activity: "Abacus Art"

- Choose a 3-digit number
- Draw it on an abacus (use dots for beads) and color the hundreds/tens/ones places differently.
- Write its expanded form ($200 + 40 + 5$) below.
- Bonus: Find 3 numbers in your house (e.g., page numbers, price tags) and write their names (e.g., "One hundred five").

2. Addition

Activity: "Shopping Fun!"

- Pretend to buy toys! Cut out 2 pictures (e.g., teddy = ₹120, car = ₹135).
- Paste them and add their prices in scrap book ($120 + 135 = ?$).
- Bonus: Play "Roll & Add" with family: Roll a dice twice to make 2-digit numbers (e.g., 3 & 5 = 35) and add them.

3. Subtraction

Activity: "Cookie Subtraction"

- Draw 10 cookies on a SCRAP BOOK.
- Cross out some (e.g., 4) and write the subtraction fact ($10 - 4 = 6$).
- Bonus: Help your parents subtract while shopping (e.g., "If we buy $2/5$ apples, how many are left?").

General Instructions:

- Use color, stickers, or real-life examples (coins, toys).
- Submit your work in a folded paper booklet with a "Math Wizard" cover.
- Parent's Note: Praise your child for trying!

Reward: The most creative work gets a "Math Star" badge!

SUBJECT - ENGLISH LITERATURE

Theme: "Storyland Adventures!"

1. A Monster in the Storeroom Activity: "Create Your Friendly Monster!"

- Draw and color a friendly monster from the story (or invent your own!).
- Give it a name and write 3 sentences about it (e.g., "My monster loves cookies!").
- Bonus: Act out the monster's voice and record a short video with a family member!

2. I'd like to be a Lighthouse

Activity: "Shining Lighthouse Diary"

- Draw a tall lighthouse on a sheet. Cut out a small paper light to glue at the top and paste it in scrap book.
- Write one wish you'd like the lighthouse to help with (e.g., "I wish it could guide lost puppies home!").
- Bonus: Sing the poem like a sea shanty (use a towel as a "sailor's scarf!").

3. The Cracked Pot

Activity: "Perfectly Imperfect Pots!"

- Mould a clay or play dough pot (cracks allowed!). Decorate it with beads/buttons.
- Write 2 lines about why cracks can be special (e.g., "My pot lets flowers peek through!").
- Bonus: Water plants with a real pot and observe how it's useful (just like the story!).

General Instructions:

- Use bright color, glitter, or recycled materials.
- Compile your work in a "Storybook Folder" (decorate with stars/sea waves).

- Parent's Note: Encourage your child to narrate their favourite part of each story.

Reward: The most imaginative work gets a "Storytelling Star"Badge

SUBJECT - ENGLISH GRAMMAR

"Grammar Fun Time!"

1. Alphabetical Order Adventure

Activity: "ABC Treasure Hunt"

- Step 1: List 10 things you love (e.g., apple, ball, cat, dog, elephant).
- Step 2: Arrange them in alphabetical order in a colourful chart.
- Bonus Challenge: Find and write 5 words from your storybooks in A-Z order.
- Fun Tip: Sing the ABC song while sorting!

2. The Sentences

Activity: "Build-a-Sentence"

- Step 1: Cut out words from old magazines/newspapers.
 - Step 2: Create 3 funny sentences (e.g., "The pink elephant dances on a cake!"). Paste them on your scrap book.
 - Bonus Challenge: Draw a picture to match one sentence.
- Fun Tip: Act out your sentences like a mini-play!

Reward: The neatest and most creative work gets a "Grammar Superstar" badge!

SUBJECT - GENERAL KNOWLEDGE

Theme: "Discover & Shine!"

1. I Can Introduce Myself

Activity: "All about Me" Passport

- Create a "passport" by folding an A4 sheet into 4 parts.
- Fill each section with:

i) My Photo/Drawing

ii) 3 Cool Facts (e.g., "I can climb trees!")

iii) My Favourite Things (color, food, game)

iv) My Dream Job (e.g., astronaut, teacher)

- Bonus: Practice introducing yourself in front of a mirror like a news reporter!

2. My Body Parts

Activity: "Body Parts Scavenger Hunt"

- Trace your hand on paper and label 5 parts (thumb, palm, etc.).
- Go on a hunt at home to find objects shaped like body parts (e.g., fork = fingers, buttons = eyes). Paste or draw them on scrap book.
- Bonus: Play "Simon Says" with family using body part commands!

3. Mom's Choice

Activity: "Super Mom Interview"

- Ask your mom 5 fun questions (e.g., "What was your favourite game as a kid?").
- Write her answers in scrap book.
- Draw or paste a picture of you and your mom doing something special together.
- Bonus: Help mom with her favourite chore and take a photo!

4. Different Parts of a Car

Activity: "Build-a-Car" Collage

- Cut out car parts from magazines (wheels, windows, etc.) or draw them.
- Assemble your dream car on paper and label 4 parts in scrap book (e.g., steering wheel, headlights).
- Bonus: Take a walk to spot 5 different car color and list them!

Parent's Note: Encourage your child to ask curious questions about each topic.

Reward: The most creative explorer gets a "Junior Scientist" badge!
